I celebrated the day yesterday, attending an event hosted by the city of Irving. There I listened to Alaina Oommen (5C scholar) read an essay reflecting on her understanding of MLK's ideas. Her poise and her eloquence were a tribute to her parents and, I would like to think, to Great Hearts Irving.

I spent some time rereading "Letter from a Birmingham Jail" for I had recalled Mr. King regularly alluding to and quoting from texts that will likely be familiar to all Great Hearts students by their senior year. In one paragraph he quotes the Apostle Paul, John Bunyan, Abraham Lincoln, Thomas Jefferson, and Jesus Christ. In other parts of the text he reflects the ideas of Martin Buber, Thomas Aquinas, Augustine, The Supreme Court, T.S Elliot and Shakespeare. Poets, Writers, Thinkers, Judges, Founders, Leaders. There are others who also shaped his thinking and certainly others who understand the life and legacy of MLK better than I, but I was encouraged by the evident depth and breadth of his learning which prepared him for such as time as his, when our nation needed a leader like him.

This holiday, this pause in the week, allowed me to consider the gratitude I have for the Great Hearts Irving community of families and friends who make a way for many students to be educated in a manner that will prepare them well for a life of service to their fellows.

K-5th Grade Spring YMCA Soccer

Great Hearts teams are now forming for K-5 Spring soccer in the YMCA recreational league.



The teams are coed, and there are three different age groups: 5/6YO (K&1st), 7/8YO (2nd&3rd), and 9/10YO (4th&5th), often referred to respectively as 6U, 8U, and 10U.

The sign-up deadline is mid February (exact date to be confirmed) to give sufficient time to order team shirts before the start of games on March 2. Cost is \$60 for members of the YMCA, \$75 for non-members.

The season is scheduled to go from March 2 to April 20. There are 8 games in the season, all games will be played Saturdays at North Lake College. Practice times will be determined with your coach, although traditionally GH teams have practices at North Lake on Thursday evenings. Practices usually start a week or two before the games start.

You can sign up online and pay by credit card here.

Alternatively, you can go in person to the YMCA, fill out the registration form and pay with cash, check, or credit card.

When registering, take **PARTICULAR CARE** to specify the school as **GREAT HEARTS**, and to specify the **CORRECT** shirt size.

Brad Bell has volunteered to serve as a liaison between the Great Hearts community and the YMCA to help in organizing the soccer teams and to help ensure the best possible experience. We had quite a good season in the fall, and look forward to another good season this spring. We do expect increased participation over the 5 teams we had in the fall, so we will likely be looking for more volunteer coaches.
