Deficiency Notices

On Friday, families of students struggling in particular classes will receive notices indicating areas for improvement, and we want to clarify what these notices are and what they are not. Deficiency and Academic Notices are being sent through the Jupiter system this year. Please check your junk/spam folder in case any were put there.

- 1. **Deficiency notices only define a starting point.** They are not blanket judgments, nor do they mean your child cannot succeed at our school. They do indicate that at a month into the year, we find your child struggling in these specific areas of knowledge, skills, or habits.
- 2. **Deficiency notices are calls for focus, not calls for alarm.** We notify you of these deficiencies so you can begin working with us in addressing them.
- 3. It is our plan to address these deficiencies. Although some methods of addressing these deficiencies are beyond our control (students actually reading and doing homework; parents encouraging diligence in their children and being supportive of the school's curriculum and the teacher's assignments), many ways to address student deficiencies are available to us as a school; and it is our intention to address the areas of knowledge, skills, and habits where we believe your children need work.
- 4. **Your proper response is important.** First, please, steel yourself against the typical defenses, such as, "the teacher doesn't like me," or "he never teaches us anything," or "she always loses my homework," or "I know all this already, but I just don't test well." Encourage your child to look at the areas defined by the deficiency notice as an area for focused improvement--an area to be revisited again in short order. Ask them to do their work, follow the teacher's directions, and seek help.

With the growth of knowledge, the cultivation of skills in careful reading, as well as the development of good work and study habits, the children can make genuine progress. They will, moreover, be on the road to success not

merely in school, but in any field of responsibility to which life might ultimately lead them.
